This year's contestants are Sienna Surgener and Claire Banducci, both of Bakersfield, and Olivia Vieira of San Luis Obispo.

Sienna is the daughter of Lester and Melinda Surgener. She is a junior at Garces Memorial High School and plans to attend Cal Poly San Luis Obispo to study Animal Science. She raised and showed dairy heifers through Garces Memorial Future Farmers of America. Sienna is very active in her high school and has been playing Albion Development Player League Soccer for the past eleven years. She is a Junior Ambassador for the fair and a Junior Leader for the Kairos Retreat.

Claire, daughter of Jamie and Candice Banducci, is studying Animal Science at Bakersfield College and would like to become a High School Agriculture Teacher.
